The Town recently completed the reconstruction of its Main Street. The project is valued at \$11 million and includes improvements to sidewalks, seating areas, roads, signage, among many other upgrades.

The Rotary Champlain Wendat Park consists of 90 acres located on the waterfront of Penetanguishene Harbour.

The park has been revitalized and enhanced with the development of the Legacy Walkway, a 7,000 sq. ft. splash pad, playground, observation deck, paved Trans Canada Trail, amphitheatre and arboretum.
